

Christmas is not limited to one day because the entire season reminds the faithful to live the spirit of the season, to meditate over the intervention of God in the human history and the immense love of God towards the humanity, to prepare our hearts and lives to give birth to Jesus in our concrete life situations and to share the joy of Christmas to others.

Mary and Joseph have a significant place in the incarnation of the Word of God. Mary's deep faith and her surrender to the will of God made her God bearer and God giver. St Joseph executed the plans for the Holy Family according to the command and direction of God. They discerned God's will because they believed that God's plan is the best plan for their life.

The shepherds went with haste to the stable and found Mary and Joseph and the babe (Lk 2: 16) wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger (Lk 2:12). "And the shepherds returned, glorifying and

praising God for all they had heard and seen" (Lk 2:20). During Christmas we halt with wonder before the manger and encounter the same child Jesus and we go back to our houses / lives with excitement glorifying and praising God for what God has done in the human history. The life of the shepherds was not the same after meeting the babe in the manger and they became the first missionaries to communicate the message of the birth of the saviour. Let us confess with the words of the Evangelist John: "We have beheld his glory, glory as of the only-begotten Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (Jn 1:14).

THE CALL TO BE A SYNODAL CHURCH

Bangalore 11th November, 2022

I. PREAMBLE

We, the member-bishops of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of India (CBCI), representing 174 dioceses, comprising over 22 million faithful belonging to the Latin, Syro – Malabar and Syro – Malankara sui iuris Churches in India, gathered, for the first time after the pandemic, at St John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bengaluru, from November 7 – 11, 2022 to reflect on the theme The Call to be a Synodal Church.

II. THE JOURNEY SO FAR

The Church is the People of God journeying on pilgrimage towards the Kingdom of God. In response to the call of Pope Francis, all sectors of the Church – bishops, priests, the Institutes of consecrated life and lay faithful – engaged on a massive consultation exercise. The experiences and insights of parishes and dioceses were collated in the national syntheses of our three sui iuris Churches. As we listened to the voices of tens of thousands enshrined in the national synthesis, we sensed the deep love of the faithful for the Church. Several felt they were being listened to for the first time. For some who had distanced themselves from the Church due to various reasons, the Synod consultation was a homecoming. Families expressed their joy at the synod consultation as it provided a platform for them to share their concerns and to listen on one other. We noted how in some Churches ancient structure were still in place whereby decisions are arrived at through discernment of what the Holy Spirit is saying in and through the entire faith community at the parish, diocesan and national levels.

The consolidated reports, which reflect the elements of Communion, Participation and Mission envisaged by Pope Francis, were very inspiring and encouraging. They reveal how, by and large, the faithful have entered enthusiastically into the synodal process. We became aware too of the great amount of work being done by many self – sacrificing priests, members of consecrated life and lay faithful in building up the Church through different forms of the apostolate. Many are engaged in education, health, social work and advocacy programmes at the local and national level. Despite opposition from vested interests, these initiatives aimed at human welfare and national development continue.

III. THE BISHOPS JOURNEYING TOGETHER

For the Bishops, the 35th Plenary Assembly was truly a journey together. We were fortunate to have the guidance of the Secretary General of the Synod of Bishops as a resource person. We arrived at a clearer understanding that the Church is constitutively Synodal. The Church is a communion comprising the lay faithful, the religious and the pastors listening to one other, and in doing so, they listen to the Holy Spirit. Synodality implies that every member of the Church has a role to play in the Church's mission.

We Bishops were reminded of the foundational importance of Baptism which makes us a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation (cf. 1 Pet 2:9). Through Baptism all the faithful share a common dignity and vocation. Every baptised person is called to participation in the mission of the Church. The Church exists to proclaim the 'Good News' that God our Father loves us and cares for us (cf. Mt 6:26, 30). He loved the world so much that he sent his Son not to condemn the world but to save it (cf. Jn 3:16). He has poured out his Spirit into our hearts enabling us to call him Abba Father (cr. Rom 5:5, 8:15). We listen and discern together what the Spirit is saying to the Churches (cf. Rev 3: 22).

In calling for a Synodal Church, Pope Francis is inviting the Church back to its origins as portrayed in the Acts of the Apostles where decisions were taken though a process of consultation and discernment (cf. Acts 6:2,11:1-18,13:1-3.15:6). It is the Church envisioned in chapter two of Lumen Gentium which depicted the Church as the People of God.

IV. THE JOURNEY AHEAD

Synodality is an ongoing process. The first phase of the process, which began with Pope Francis' call for a Synod on Synodality, ended with the close of the diocesan and national journeys. But the Church in India continues its synodal journey. We commit ourselves to walk together and build up a Synodal Church working for a better India, Asia and world.

The Bishops gathered at the 35th CBCI Plenary Assembly outlined some avenues of action as the Church moves forward towards the synodal journey as the continental level.

- 1. Transparency is essential for the Church to grow in authentic synodality. Synodal structures already existing in the Church, such as Parish and Diocesan Pastoral Councils, must be empowered so that without succumbing to pressure groups, major decisions regarding parish and diocesan matters are to be made consensus. Under the leadership of the pastors, all listen to the Holy Spirit who Jesus promised would always be with his Church (cf. Jn 14:15–16).
- 2. We will work towards eradicating any semblance of authoritarianism on the part of the Church leaders, so that authority is seen not as domination but as service to imitation of Jesus who came not to be served but to serve (cf. Mt 20:28). We regret that due to authoritarianism on the part of some pastors, adequate scope has sometimes not been given for the lay faithful to play their part in the life and mission of the Church.
- 3. A synodal Church will not become a reality unless we imbibe a 'synodal culture'. We would like to ensure that right from the early

stages of seminary formation to later ongoing formation, our priests are trained to look upon themselves as servants, stewards of the manifold grace of God (cf. 1 Pet 4:10). Likewise, all the baptized must adopt a synodal mindset assuming coresponsibility for the mission of the Church.

- 4. We commit ourselves to build an inclusive Church where no one is left out and all are welcome, especially the poor and the marginalized. We want to listen and respond particularly to the people at the peripheries the migrants, refugees, indigenous peoples: we will give special attention to the differently abled.
- 5. We express our special solicitude for our families striving to remain faithful to the Church's teaching on human life. We feel the pain of those couples who find themselves estranged from the Church because of their irregular marital situation. We will explore ways of providing them pastoral care and access to the sacraments.
- 6. We rejoice at seeing how the Spirit constantly raises up new ecclesial movements and associations, thus ensuring the perennial vitality of the Church. It devolves on us, the pastors, not to quench the Spirit but to test everything and hold to what comes from the Holy Spirit (cf. 1 Thes 5:19).
- 7. Humanity is growing in its awareness of the need for the earth, our common home. For too long, nature has been abused, its resources exploited without a thought for future generations. We will do whatever lies in our power to save the earth.
- 8. The Catholic Church undertakes the synodal journey not in isolation, but united with all disciples of Jesus. We will seek to work together with all Christian churches and ecclesial communities. There are more things that unite rather than divide us. We all believe in "one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of us all who works in all and through all and in all" (Eph 4:5–7).



9. Synodality is a call from God to walk together with the great human family. We journey with our neighbours who belong to different religions. We will intensify the inter-religious dialogue initiatives which have been going on after Vatican II, and in particular, promote the Dialogue of Life and Action, moving wherever possible from Basic Ecclesial Communities to Basic Human Communities. We want to listen to what the Spirit is saying to every man and woman of good will.

V. CONCLUSION

During these days of journeying together at the Plenary Assembly, we bishops identified very much with the two disciples on the road to Emmaus (Lk 24: 13 – 35). The gospels often show Jesus 'on a journey'. In this incident, he journeyed alongside the two discouraged and distressed disciples to Emmaus, responding to the questions and concerns lurking in their hearts. He did the same to us, Bishops. He walked with us. As we listened to his Word, our eyes were opened to recognise him in the breaking of bread. Strengthened by his encounter with the Risen Lord, we go back to our dioceses to take up the mission entrusted to us. There are many problems awaiting us like fundamentalism, the erosion of civil liberties and so on. But the Risen Lord is always with us, giving us strength to build up a better India and a better world.

We place all our plans and efforts to implement them in the hands of Mary, our Mother, model of synodality. May she who guided the first step of her son Jesus and who was present with the infant Church at Pentecost guide our steps too as we walk together under the lordship of Jesus and the leadership of Pope Francis towards the Kingdom.

Belonging to scheduled castes and tribes such as, Kori, Yadav, Singh, Baiga, Saket, etc. these women come from poor families of our neighbouring villages named Lohara, Chauphal, Karimatti, Morcha, Katauli, and Gahira etc. This institution is really an assistance to these women to stand on themselves for their daily sustenance.

UDAY BALABHAVAN

After the corona pandemic and summer holidays Uday Balabhavan was reopened on 20th June 2022. Uday Balabhavan is extremely happy to accommodate 73 students in this new scholastic year. These students belong to the different categories of scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and backward classes. Most of these students come from different villages of Sidhi, Singrauli, Satna districts namely, Dariya, Bagubudatha, Bhajohar, Bari, Bumri, Bhatta, Tamsar, Kargil, Dalappeer, Pateri, Tejva, Tamsar, Kochila, Joba, Sidhi, Dol and Saro etc.

This institution helps these students to remain in the boarding and do their studies in Uday Shishu Mandir. We sincerely express our intense gratitude to all the benefactors and well-wishers for their generous

The Sacred Heart Convent, Satna erected on 14th June 1973, has its humble inauguration of Golden Jubilee on 14th June 2022. It is a matter of great joy and contentment as we look back over the past years.

Sacred Heart Sisters of Kothamangalam Province were invited by Late Bishop, Mar Abraham D. Mattam to serve here in Satna Diocese. Sacred Heart Convent Satna is the second mission community of Kothamangalam Province in North India. For laying its foundation, Late Mother General Sr Theresa Margaret reached Satna along with Sr Divine, Late Sr Genevieve, Sr Pius, Sr Assumpta, Sr Christy and Sr Reena on 13th June, 1973. On 14th June Bishop Mar Abraham D. Mattam blessed and inaugurated the second convent in the diocese of Satna in a rented house at Civil Line, Satna. Sr Divine was the Superior and Late Sr Genevieve, Sr Pius and Sr Reena were the pioneer members of the new convent.

His Excellency (late) Mar Abraham D Mattam and Rev. Fathers along with Br Joseph Naduvileparambil VC were very supportive and helped our Sisters in every way of life they could. Initially the food was served from the Bishop's House. Sisters learned cycling and travelled on bicycles to reach out to the people especially to the needy ones. Vijaya Shishu Vidyalaya, a play school with kindergarten was established on 3rd July 1973 in a rented building. In 1974, the school was shifted to the Church compound. In the following year, the school was further shifted to the newly constructed building and the school was christened Christ Jyoti and Sr Pius SH was appointed the first Headmistress of the school.

The foundation stone for the convent was laid on 23rd April, 1974 by (late) Bishop Mar Abraham D. Mattam. The construction of the

convent was completed very fast by the strenuous efforts of Sisters and Fathers. The convent was blessed and inaugurated on 26th January, 1975. Our pioneer sisters rendered their service with happiness and generosity; although they had to encounter numerous difficulties related, such as, the local language, financial issues and adverse climatic conditions. Education and parish work were the main apostolate here and we are still continuing.

The Golden Jubilee Year was inaugurated with the lighting of the lamp by our Bishop Mar Joseph Kodakallil and our Provincial Superior, Very Rev. Sr Grace Poomkudy on 14th June in the Convent Chapel. We have gathered around the bounteous table of the Lord to celebrate the solemn thanksgiving Holy Qurbana by His Excellency and concelebrants were Rev. Fr Thomas Thelakat, the Proto-syncellus and Rev. Fr Augustine Chittuparambil, the Syncellus of the diocese. Priests and Sisters from the neighbouring communities have added colour to the function.

Almost all the schools are now able to pay the salary in full and to pay the remaining dues. Good fresh admissions have come to all the schools. Some schools have started to finish the necessary maintenances. And now all our institutions are functioning in full swing.
